**Details:** Over 90% of English words come from three language origins - Anglo-Saxon (or Old English), Latin, and Greek. We will delve into the structure of words and how etymology, the study of word history and origin, influence instruction. We will concentrate on the role that phonemes (the sounds of a language) and morphemes (the meaningful prefixes, suffixes and roots) play depending on word structure and origin.

Word structure as well as activities for context clues, dictionary/thesaurus use, semantic relationships such as antonyms and synonyms, and for figurative language will be addressed to improve and broaden vocabulary for all students in all subject areas.

Frameworks for instruction, along with numerous instructional strategies and activities will be provided.

*Intended Audience:* This workshop is designed for teachers, tutors, reading specialists, speech and language therapists, paraprofessionals and parents of struggling readers.



**Speaker:**

**Marcia Henry, PhD**

Marcia Henry brings 60 years of experience working in the field of language acquisition and dyslexia as a tutor, teacher, clinician, and professor. Dr. Henry received her Ph.D. in educational psychology from Stanford University. Prior to retirement in 1995, she was a professor in the Division of Special Education at San Jose State University where she taught and directed the Center for Educational Research on Dyslexia. Marcia became a Fulbright Lecturer/ Research Scholar teaching at the University of Trondheim, Norway in 1991.

She speaks frequently at regional, national and international conferences on topics related to intervention strategies for dyslexic learners. She also writes for a variety of professional journals, and serves on the editorial board for *Dyslexia*, the journal of The British Dyslexia Association.

Since retirement Marcia has taught at several universities. She provides teacher training related to teaching reading and related language arts, and consults with several school districts and states on informed reading instruction. Dr. Henry is the author of *WORDS* (2<sup>nd</sup> Ed.) as well as

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*Unlocking Literacy: Effective Decoding and Spelling Instruction* (2<sup>nd</sup> Ed.) She is primary author of *Patterns for Success in Reading and Spelling*.

She is a fellow in the Academy of Orton-Gillingham Practitioners and Educators. She is a past-president of The International Dyslexia Association (IDA), serving as president from 1992-1996. For IDA's 50th anniversary in 1999, Marcia compiled and co-edited *Dyslexia - Samuel T. Orton and His Legacy* for IDA's. She received the Margaret Byrd Rawson Lifetime Achievement Award from IDA in 2000. Marcia and her husband retired on Madeline Island in Lake Superior and she was a volunteer tutor in the Madeline Island Elementary School for almost 20 years. She and Burke returned to her hometown of Rochester, MN in 2015 where she serves on The Reading Center Board of Directors.
